Dear Classmates and Friends:

The display will encompass our classmates' fiction, non-fiction, poetry, textbooks, collections and anthologies, and significant journal and magazine entries.

In order to assemble the display, we are asking not only class authors but also the widows and friends of deceased classmates to send an email by **February 20, 2015** to fward5@nc.rr.com, with the titles of the works that you would like to display, together with the publisher's name and date of publication. Please also include, as an editable document, a single-paragraph biographical sketch of approximately 200 words, written in the first person (or in the third in the case of deceased classmates). This short essay should include the author's reason for writing the piece and a personal statement of its significance. (Owing to space limitations, please send the titles of **no more than two works.**)

Once we have received your list, we will send you a Loan Agreement, which must be signed and sent with your publication(s) **directly to Jennifer Julier, Association of Yale Alumni, 232 York Street, New Haven, CT 06511, by no later than May 1st.** To identify the purpose of your package, please write "**1965 Reunion Exhibit**" on the exterior. (Your books will be returned to you in September after the conclusion of the exhibit.) Please note that we are unable to display photocopies of title pages of books or of articles.

As you are already aware, the impressive list of authors in our class reflects a vast and diverse range of talent and production. On behalf of the Reunion Committee, we hope that all of you, either on your own or on behalf of a deceased classmate, will participate in this enterprise by communicating your interest to us. Additionally, if you know a classmate who is for any reason reluctant

to submit his own work, please encourage him to do so. Because much time will be required to prepare displays commensurate with the quality of the expected contents, it is important that you let us hear from you as soon as possible.

We are grateful to all of you who are willing to allow us to feature this impressive aspect of the accomplishment of the Class of '65.
